Capital Improvement Board votes to approve live-streaming camera at Terre Haute Children's Museum

Terre Haute, IN - June 18, 2020 – At Wednesday's Capital Improvement Board meeting, the CIB board moved forward with the approval of a proposed downtown feature - a live-streaming camera housed at the Terre Haute Children's Museum. The camera will sit on the roof of the 3-story museum with a front-row view of the convention center construction as well as the commencement of construction scheduled for September.

Nations Group, the project manager, donated \$8,000 for the mounting and software for the camera and its streaming capabilities. Garmong Construction Service, the project construction manager, donated the camera.

"This is a monumental and historic project for Terre Haute. We are happy to partner with Garmong and the Children's Museum to provide footage that will outline history-in-the-making directly in front of us," states Steve Bauer of Nations Group.

The live-streaming footage will be accessible 24/7 on the Capital Improvement Board's website and can be viewed at the Terre Haute Children's Museum.

Susan Turner, Executive Director of the Terre Haute Children's Museum, presented on the importance and impact this camera would have.

"At the Children's Museum, we find every opportunity to educate our guests on a variety of aspects. Our *Under Construction Exhibit*, located on the north end of the building facing the proposed convention center, was created so kids could learn about the construction industry and witness firsthand a historic downtown Terre Haute project. This live-streaming camera will provide another unique learning opportunity," states Turner.

The Museum also will house a continued stream of construction from start to finish in the *Under Construction Exhibit*. The camera will be installed in the coming weeks with live-streaming available upon installation.
